Christ, Our Guiding Star

The great feast of Epiphany celebrates Christ as God’s Light, drawing the whole world to God. A few years ago, Pope Francis began one of his Epiphany homilies with these words: “Like a rising star (cf. Num 24:17), Jesus comes to enlighten all peoples and to brighten the nights of humanity. Today, with the Magi, let us lift our eyes to heaven and ask: “Where is the child who has been born?” (Mt 2:2). Where can we find and encounter our Lord? The Holy Father identifies three “places” where we are to seek and find the Lord: restless questioning, the risk of journeying, and the wonder of worship.

The first “place” God hides for us to seek and find him is in restless questioning. Every human heart has lots of questions, many questions that demand infinite answers. The Magi had a yearning for the infinite and found themselves marveling at the brilliance of a star. The star led them to more questioning: Where is the child who has been born? God creates a yearning for himself inside us, and we restlessly long for him. Our faith journey is propelled by this restlessness that God puts in our hearts. Finding Him gives our hearts their most needed restful peace.

The yearning for God invites us to the journey of faith. It is a journey with God to find God. The Magi set out on a journey full of risks, without safe roads and clear maps. The journey of faith requires that we trust the star, Jesus, and keep following where he leads. Without a continuous journey in constant dialogue with the Lord, faith cannot grow. We must be on a constant journey with Christ, our guiding Star.

Journeying with the Lord brings us to encounter him in the wonder of worship. At the end of their long journey and tiring quest, the Magi entered the house, where “they saw the child with Mary, his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage” (v. 11). This is what really matters: our restlessness, our questioning, our spiritual journeys and the practice of our faith must all converge in the worship of the Lord. In his presence, we are absorbed in the mystery of his love, where gifts of selves are exchanged in an endless communion. So, join the Magi and bow before the infant Christ today.
