We thank God for the gift of our families. Through them, we take part in the mystery of love before we even know what love means. Jesus, Mary and Joseph were three, but on the level of love they were one. That is the greatness of the Mystery of Bethlehem. Love can bring it all together. No one can be joyful without maturing in love.

Without words, Jesus gives us a perfect example on the Cross. Family conflicts are often hinged on mutual blame. Naturally, family members have basic expectations of one another. There is generally no confusion of roles. But mutual blame sometimes persists, just because we are human. This is where the grace of God makes a big difference. We remember that being joined to Christ on the Cross now makes us human beings with a divine heart. The reconciling act of Christ on the Cross means taking the guilt of the family and ensuring peace. Our acceptance of being initiated into Christ is a commitment to keep trying to live with this kind of heart in all our relationships, especially in our families. May the loving heart of Jesus reign in all our homes. Amen.
