Upon You the Lord Shines

We have become so used to electricity that we rarely notice the big difference it makes in our lives during the night. Today’s feast of the Epiphany is about light, not the kind of light we need to light up our homes, but the kind of light that burns within us and throughout humankind. We can think of this kind of light as a vision: it is the gift of being able to see more deeply into our purpose for living. In place of deliberate blindness caused by selfishness and the shared darkness caused by human pride, we now have a child who brings God’s very light into our lives. In the creed, we say, “God from God, light from light.”

The route of the Magi is a symbol of our path to Christ. Almost always, we come from afar, across the desert of faith, surrounded by darkness. Some get disoriented, others get lost, but a few lift their eyes to the sky and, in the middle of the night, discover the star; we must follow it with all hope and persevere to the end. It takes humility to allow oneself to be guided. Sometimes, we assume that we can figure things out by ourselves. Some people call themselves “Social Catholics.” They don’t believe in going to Church because they think that all you need is to try and do good to people around you and show them love. But unfortunately, when they talk about love, they measure it by their own standards. The human standard of love is very low compared to God’s.

God is the Love for whom we are made and in whom we find our deepest fulfillment. At Mass, as the heavenly Star, Jesus presents God’s standard of love to us, inviting us into himself for our deepest peace and joy. The humble and wise thing to do is to follow this Star every day. Little wonder why the Magi are called wise men. We can learn from them.
