God’s Word Shines His Light on our World

Jesus has come to be known as the Galilean, even though he was born in the southern Davidic city of Bethlehem in Judea. In fact, Nazareth, where he grew up, was one of the worst places in Galilee. Nathaniel said, “Can anything good come from Nazareth?” (Jn. 1:46). Compared to Bethlehem, Galilee is a place filled with moral darkness. Jesus beginning his life and mission there is very symbolic.

Today’s readings tell us that Jesus’ proclamation of God’s Word of truth is a light that scatters the darkness in our world and in our lives. It says, “Land of Zebulun and land of Naphtali, the way to the sea, beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles, the people who sit in darkness have seen a great light, on those dwelling in a land overshadowed by death light has arisen.” Matthew’s gospel tells us that this light is the word of Jesus, who began his preaching in Galilee, a northern territory filled with pagan corruption because most of their original inhabitants had been driven away into exile and replaced with pagan peoples and cultures. It was real darkness. It would have been normal for a religious teacher, like Jesus, to do his preaching and teaching mainly in Jerusalem. But Jesus chose to begin his ministry in Galilee, a place filled with moral darkness. Since then, darkness has begun to be driven back all over the world, and we are sure that one day it will disappear completely through the power of the Word of God.

The Third Sunday in Ordinary Time is celebrated as the “Sunday of the Word of God.” The emphasis today is on the vital importance of shining the light of God’s Word on our lives every day. We can imagine what the world would have been without the light of God’s word. To be able to shine the light of God’s Word in the world, we must commit to shining this light daily on our own lives. Gradually, the cold ice of lies will melt away and darkness will disappear. You don’t have to read the bible from cover to cover. Through the daily Mass readings, God answers our prayer to “give us this day, our daily bread.” As God’s Family, let us feed on this bread every day.
